Energy Consumption:

Scottish Power – in Jan our deficit was just over £2,500. Our direct debit went up to £782 per month. Deficit is now showing as approx £1,400 with the next bill due end of April. Consumption for March looks to be lower than previous months, probably as it's warmer and we've done various things to the system to try and reduce how much the heat pump fires up.

I have also discovered that the smart meter does not receive good enough signal, so it is not communicating with Scottish Power and we still need to give manual readings. I was not aware of this until today. This means they've been estimating our consumption, although our last bill in January was based on my meter reading, not an estimated one.
